An opportunity to develop solutions to consumer, financial, economic, business, legal, political and employment issues in order to make informed and responsible decisions as individuals and as part of the community.






Commerce Values and Attitudes

fundamental rights, rules and laws that promote fairness, justice and equity in society through informed, responsible and active citizenship.


